## a note from Pastor Jim...

The month of August promises to be a month of transition, change, challenge, and opportunity. Things will happen that are beyond our control. Thankfully, we know that God is in control even when we want to be.

Sadly, due to circumstances beyond our control, we will be ending our ten-year run with Shining Stars. The preschool ministry has been one that has impacted lives, given parents a place to trust with their children and given a great head start for children getting ready for school. Due to COVID induced shutdowns, reduced attendance, and staffing changes, the leadership team determined that we should close the ministry for a year, rebrand and reopen for fall of 2022. The last day of the Summer Preschool session and the last day for Shining Stars sponsored activities, including the after-school program, will be August 12.

We are also getting ready for the return of the Harper Bazaar. We began over a month ago collecting items for the sale and have been blessed with many boxes of wonderful things to sell and donate to help people in our community. The proceeds from this sale will be donated to Lamb House and the Central Missouri Foster Care and Adoption Association. Anything not sold will be donated to Share the Harvest. Advertising is happening, plans are being made, help is being enlisted and Jeanne Gordon and her team are doing a wonderful job.

Billye Bennett is busy restarting our parish nurse program, planning activities, and working to help establish an environment that supports our physical and emotional health. She will be coordinating our grief support group efforts which is scheduled to start in September with an organizational meeting on Monday, September 13th, at 10:00 am.

In addition, we will be joining with a group from the hospital to attend several plays at the Lyceum Theater, details are in this addition of the newsletter, but the ticket deadline to see *Singing in the Rain* is August 2, and for *Sister Act* the deadline is August 9.

Tentatively, we have scheduled a fall kickoff/restart for August 29. The timing of this event will depend upon the COVID situation and will be subject to change. The last thing we want to do is create an event that exposes individuals to COVID.

Also, in the works for September, the return of Adult Sunday School with a potential children's class. Judy Smits has agreed to offer a children's class if needed. We will also be offering a Bible 101 class starting with "Where did the Bible come from?" The Just Older Youth (J.O.Y) group, for those of us over 55, will also kick off in September.

The challenge in all of this will not be can we do all this, nor is it a question of resources, or do we have the ability to do different new things that create opportunities for learning, fellowship, and growth. The biggest challenge will simply be the unknown impacts of COVID. Please be careful, wear a mask, get your vaccination, and stay safe.



#### LRHS Parish Nurse Network Wellness Tip of the Month August, 2021

#### Summer Safety- Heat Illness

Heat illness occurs when the body cannot cool itself effectively through sweating, which in turn causes the body temperature to increase. Young children and people over the age of 65 are more at risk, as well as persons on certain medications that slow down sweat production and diuretics. There are two levels of heat illness - 1) Heat Exhaustion and 2) Heat Stroke.

#### **Symptoms**

#### Heat Exhaustion - mild

- Thirst/dehydration
- Fatigue/weakness
- Cramps in legs/abdomen
- Clammy skin
- Headache

#### Heat Stroke - serious

- Dizziness/diminished alertness
- Headache
- Nausea/vomiting
- Irritability
- Rapid heartbeat/rapid breathing
- Temperature of 105° F or more

#### **Severe Cases**

- Liver, brain and kidney damage
- Death

#### **Prevention**

- Air conditioning
- Decrease strenuous activities or change activities to early morning or evening hours when the temperature is cooler.
- Carry water and drink fluids regularlybefore, during and after the activity.
- Don't push the limits.
- Wear light colored, loose fitting clothes

#### How to be prepared in case of emergency **Heat Exhaustion**

- Bring person into a cool location
- Loosen clothes
- Encourage cool liquids
- Bathe in cool (not cold) water
- Call your doctor for further advice

#### **Heat Stroke**

- Call 911
- Until help arrives-get person into cool area, loosen clothing, use a cool, wet sponge or towel and fans to cool them down and DO NOT give fluids.

#### Low Vaccination Rates Could Lead to Fall Surge

The transmission of the more contagious Delta Variant in Missouri and the United States could spur a fall surge in coronavirus infections if only 75% of the eligible population is vaccinated. Delta is up to 60% more contagious than earlier variants and is expected to become the dominant strain in the United States according to Rochelle Walensky, Director of the CDC. Walensky told Americans during an appearance on ABC's Good Morning America.

Faisal Khan, MD, Director of the St. Louis Department of Public Health, the Delta Variant spreading throughout Missouri should raise alarm bells. He is all but certain that the virus will continue to spread from outstate into metropolitan areas, "threatening to erase the progress we have made beating back the virus". "Unfortunately, too many in our community and state still have not gotten vaccinated, and these are the only covid-19 patients we are seeing in our hospital beds. And concerningly, we are seeing unvaccinated teenagers and young adults with serious cases of the disease due to new variants". Dr Khan continues, "Right now we are in a race against time to hold off the Delta Variant and keep Missouri safe." This means intensifying the vaccine campaign to ensure every resident is protected.

If you have not yet gotten vaccinated, or have a child 12 or older who has not gotten theirs---please visit a vaccination site soon. Getting vaccinated is about building the power of community and protecting yourself, your family, your neighbors, and your future.


